ICS 300 Intermediate Incident Command for Expanding Incidents

June 7-9, 2022

This 3-day course covers ICS staffing and organization to include:

- Reporting, working relationships and information flow
- Transfer of Command
- Unified Command functions in a multi-jurisdictional or multi-agency incident
- ICS forms
- Resource Management
- Interagency mission planning and procurement

Who should take it:

According to FEMA, mid-level management government & nongovernmental personnel, including:

Persons serving as command staff, section chiefs, strike team & task force leaders, unit leaders, division/group supervisors, branch directors, and multi-agency coordination system/emergency operations center staff

Cost: This course is provided at no charge to participants
